And so ended a perfect reign for Queen Kathy.


















# Teamwork + Coaching = Championship



Joy, satisfaction, pride, and the true athletic spirit show on the faces of Reverend George E. Ging, our beloved pastor, John Shada, Coach, Armando Cavazos and Dave La Prairie, Co-captains of the 1962 Football Squad. The Second Division Trophy was won by these on Nov. 11 at McCabe Field, but our caption TEAMWORK plus COACHING equals CHAMPIONSHIP extends to many more than shown in this camera's eye. Our winning a title may be claimed by the team, both first and second string, the entire student body, and all of St. James parish. Not included in this picture are, Father Bernard Harrington, assistant coaches, Mr. Michael Barry and Mr. Robt. Hernbroth. The cheerleaders did much to bring victory, and last and by no means least, those "home-loving" Cheerleaders - the Sisters of St. Joseph, added a big bit to our success. Three cheers for all who won the victory!

Ferndale St. James' hiring of John Shada November, 1962 as its football coach in 1959 was a do-or-die effort that paid off handsomely. In 1958, with a small squad of less than 20 plays, St. James finished with a dismal 1-5-1 won-lost-tied league record. But under Shada's firm hand the Ferndale school has enjoyed its finest football era.

He put St. James on the comeback road in his initial season with a 7-1 record and followed up with 6-2 and 7-2 marks. Last weekend St. James achieved its first Catholic League Second Division crown in 20 years on a perfect 9-0 record. In recognition of the championship effort and a current string of 16 victories, Shada has been named The Detroit News' "Coach of the Year" in the Catholic League. The honor is the second accorded him in a 24-year coaching career. In 1949 when his St. Anthony squad upset U. of D., 19-13, in the Goodfellow game, Shada received another coach-of-the-year award.

Shada, a on-time ace University of Detroit guard (1935-37), will turn 47 on Nov. 30. A native of Grand Rapids, he starred in three sports at Catholic Central there. He earned a Ph. B. and master's degree in education at U. of D. He began coaching Titan freshmen under the late Gus Dorais.

Shada, who lives at 1911 Pinecrest, Ferndale, is father of four sons and four daughters.










Mr. Barry was always working to keep up the spirit on the team. He was not only our coach, but also our resolution, our desire, our victories.



# The Man Who Came To Dinner


